† The Confession of Sin & Declaration of Pardon

The Scripture directs us to acknowledge and confess our sins; and we should not make light of them nor hide them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with a humble, penitent, and obedient heart, in order that we may find forgiveness by His infinite goodness and mercy. Therefore, let us humbly confess our sins to God, our Father.

Gracious Heavenly Father, we have strayed from your ways like lost sheep; we have followed too much the desires of our own hearts; we have offended against your holy laws. O Lord, have mercy upon us. Spare those who confess their sins. Restore those who are penitent, according to Your promises declared in Christ Jesus our Lord; And grant, O most merciful Father, for His sake, that we may now live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of your holy Name. Amen.

Pray silently confessing particular sins, then the Minister shall say

Now lift up your heads and hear the good news: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Beloved, as Christ's minister and by the authority of His Word, I declare: Your sins are forgiven you! *Amen!*



We ask You in Your mercy, O Lord, to comfort and sustain all who in this transitory life are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity. *Amen.*

All sing a Communion bymn, then come forward to receive the Bread #204CC At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing (vs. 1e33)

Heavenly Father, we thank You for the gift of this Bread. We pray that as we eat of it in faith, the Holy Spirit would unite us more and more to our Savior, Jesus Christ, and to each other in His Body. Help us to rejoice in the Lamb of God Who gave Himself for us! *Amen!*

The Bread which we break, is it not the communion of the Body of Christ? **Yes, it is!** The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was given for you, preserve you body and soul unto everlasting life. **Amen!**

The Cup of blessing, which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? **Yes it is!**



Пeidelberg Catechism Lord's Day #21

Q. 54. What do you believe concerning the "holy, catholic Church"?
